Each recipe starts with a brief explanation of the character of the drink, followed by a list of ingredients. You can enter the number of servings you want and the ingredient measurements will automatically adjust. Next are directions for mixing the drink. Many drinks also feature vid-

The next tab is a forum where site members can share recipes, stories, interests and laughs, or ask questions. You have to register to participate

in the forum.

The third tab takes you to an advanced search page. There's a much wider range of parameters you can enter for your searches on this page than on the home page. Besides the name or drink category, you can enter multiple ingredients, the type of glass used, alcohol content, calories, voter rating and more.

A "Bartender Guide" is the next tab. This section has games is to get you over the limit as quickly as possible.

DrinksMixer is a useful site if you're looking for drink recipes, or need information on setting up a bar. It's fairly well done, with decent organization and navigation. The design and editing need to be tightened up a bit. It occupies a space between an impressive amateur site and a slick, professional site.

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
